

Perry Dye II and Elizabeth Ware

Perry Dye II was born in Chester Co, SC on June 14, 1827 to William Thomas Dye & Matilda Goins.

He died in Cleveland Co, NC Jan 10, 1892 and is buried at El Bethel Methodist Church Cemetery.

He is the grandson of John Dye I and Agnes Stone Dye. Perry's occupation is listed as Moulder.

Perry 1st married Ann Unknown and had lived at Hurricane Shoals in Spartanburg Co, SC. They had the following children: Martha C Dye Ware, Jane Ann Dye Ware, Elenora Dye, Lucy L Ware. Later, in 1870, Ann Dye and her children are residing with Berriman Dye b. 1834. Berriman Dye is thought to be another son of William T Dye and Matilda Goins.

Perry relocated to Cleveland Co, NC in the area of Kings Mountain. He married Elizabeth Ware b. Feb 14, 1844 and died April 3, 1935. Lizzie is buried at El Bethel Methodist Church Cemetery.

She was born in Lincoln Co, NC.

The children of Perry and Lizzie are: William W Dye, John R Dye, Sarah " Sallie" Dye Gamble, Thomas T Dye, and Fannie Dye Jenkins.

There are copies of Perry's Estate records available from the State of North Carolina which are several pages in number.

Martha C Dye married John C Ware Aug 22, 1872 Cleveland Co, NC

Nora, Augustus, Lily, Addie, John C Ware Jr, James, Georgia, Cora, Ollie, Mattie, Esther and William A Ware b. Aug 19, 1875 d. Nov 10, 1895.

Nora Ware married Joseph Crawford. Mattie Ware married Joseph Handcox.

Jane Ann Dye married Thomas Madison Addison Ware on Jan 22, 1873 in Cleveland Co, NC

Perry Camdon Ware, Faitha J, Lucy, Rush, Frank, Ason John, & Columbus Ware.

Jane Dye Ware died in Pine Bluff, Arkansas.

Perry Camdon Ware was born Oct 30, 1873, Rush Ware was born May 2, 1876 and died Aug 7, 1901.

Ason John Ware was born in December 1879.

Witnesses for the marriage were the children of Rev. John Wesley North; Cynthia, Wm and Sarah North. John North was previously married to the daughter of Uncle Perry Dye and Letha Ferguson.

Martha Jane Dye North, whom died in 1861.

The marriage of Lucy Dye and Boyce Ware took place at the home of the Rev. John Wesley North.

William W Dye married Mary " Mollie" Oates on Dec 28, 1898

Mary E Dye born Jan 21, 1902 and died Feb 14, 1902, Infant born Jan 1, 1901, Samuel C Dye b. Oct 1899.

John R Dye born Feb. 16 1882 d. Dec 30, 1910, buried at El Bethel Methodist Cemetery.

Sarah “ Sallie” Dye married James Joshua Gamble

Lila W Gamble, Ruby H, John T Frank, Lemuel, Robert Hood, Charley Longworth, and others unknown. Sallie was born March 5, 1884 and died Nov 26, 1929, J J Gamble was born Oct 8, 1877 and died June 25, 1966. They are buried at El Bethel Methodist Church Cemetery, Cleveland Co, NC.

Thomas T Dye married Amanda J Owens Dec 21, 1897 in the home of her Father, Ashberry Owens.

Jane Annie Dye Griggs, Manie & Edna Dye. Tom was born Sep 18, 1874 and died May 14, 1841.

Amanda was born July 11, 1874 and died July 18, 1951, They are buried at El Bethel Methodist Cemetery, Janie Annie Dye married Mr. Andrew Griggs, and Mamie is buried at El Bethel Methodist Church Cemetery at Kings Mountain, Cleveland Co, NC. She was born April 24, 1898 and died June 23, 1988.

Fannie Dye married Eli Miller Jenkins

She was born Aug 22, 1879 and died June 6, 1961 in Cleveland Co, NC

He was born Feb 14, 1860 in Lincolnton, Lincoln Co, NC to David Jenkins and Sarah Long.

The couple is buried at El Bethel Methodist Church Cemetery at Kings Mountain, Cleveland Co, NC

Andrew Jenkins Jr. was born March 15, 1899 and died Dec 19, 1909.

The Following documentation is from the Estate Records of Perry Dye II and Elizabeth Ware Dye. It is still unknown who the 1st wife was, Ann. Little is known of Berriman Dye, although we know the neighbors named a child Berriman Dillard. It is assumed he was a brother to Perry or other relative, he moved in with Ann and the Children when Perry left and went to Cleveland Co, NC and married Elizabeth Ware.

To the Clerk of the Superior Court of Cleveland County:

Your petitioners respectfully show that the said J.A. Anthony was appointed ad-
ministrator of the said Perry Dye, dec'd, by the Clerk of the Superior Court of
Cleveland County, on the 23rd day of October, 1901, and at once entered upon the
administration of said estate.

Your petitioners further show:

- I. That from the best information and knowledge which they have been able to ob-
tain the outstanding indebtedness of said estate amount to about \$400.00.
- ii. That the value of the personal estate of said intestate is nothing, since all
was allotted to the widow, Elizabeth Dye.
- iii. That, at the time of his death, the said intestate was seized and possessed
in fee simple of the following described real estate, situate in No. 4 Township,
Cleveland County, State of North Carolina, and bounded as follows: Beginning at a
stone on the west edge of the road leading by the Perry Dye homestead, D. Williams'
corner, thence S. 09 W. 75 1/4 poles to a stone, T.M.A. Ware's corner, thence
with his line N. 54 W. 119 poles to a stone in said line, Elizabeth Dye's corner,
thence with her line N. 45 E. 109 poles to a stone, her corner, in the T.O. Ware's old
line, thence with said line S. 50 1/2 E. 175 poles to a stone and pointers, D. Williams'
Line, thence with said line S. 02 W. 54 poles to the beginning corner, con-
taining 120 acres, at the value of about \$1200.00.
- iv. That the said decedent left his surviving his widow, the said Elizabeth Dye,
and the following named heirs at Law: T.T. Dye, W.W. Dye, J.R. Dye, Sallie Gamble, Nora

Mark Ware, Frank Ware, James Ware, Mattie Handcox, Ollie Ware, Esther Ware, Georgia Ware, Cora Ware and Samuel Ware.

V. That W. W. Dye, J. R. Dye and Sallie Gamble are the sons and daughter of the said Perry Dye, dec'd, and each has an estate of inheritance in fee in the said described real estate, consisting of one undivided 1/8 part thereof, subject to the dower of the said Elizabeth Dye and the homestead of the said J. R. Dye and the said Sallie Gamble and the said indebtedness.

VI. That T. T. Dye is the son of the said Perry Dye, dec'd, and has an estate of inheritance in fee in the said real estate, consisting of one undivided 1/8 part thereof, subject to the said dower interest, homestead and indebtedness, and he has also an estate of purchase in fee in said real estate, consisting of one undivided 2/8 thereof, he having heretofore purchased the undivided 1/8 interest in the said described real estate, each, of Mrs. T. A. A. Ware and Mrs. Fannie Jenkins, who are sisters of the said T. T. Ware and daughters of the said Perry Dye, dec'd, all subject to the said dower interest, the said homestead and said indebtedness, and deeds for same are on file.

VII. That Nora Crawford, Augustus Ware, Lily Ware, Addie Ware, John C. Ware, Jr., James Ware, Mattie Handcox, Ollie Ware, Esther Ware, Georgia Ware and Cora Ware are the sons and daughters of Mrs. Martha Ware, dec'd, who was a daughter of the said Perry Dye, dec'd, and each has an estate of inheritance in fee in said real estate, consisting of one undivided 1/8 part thereof, subject to the said dower interest, to said homesteads and to said indebtedness.

VIII. That Bertie Ware, Albert Ware, Frank Ware, Mark Ware and Samuel Ware are the sons and daughter of Mrs. Lucy Ware, dec'd, who was a daughter of the said Perry Dye, dec'd, and each has an estate of inheritance in fee in said real estate, consisting of one undivided 1/40 part thereof, subject to said dower interest, to said homesteads and to said indebtedness. †

IX. That John C. Ware, Sr. was the husband of Mrs. Martha Ware who died after the death of her father, Perry Dye and Boyce Ware was the husband of Mrs. Lucy Ware who died after the death of her father, Perry Dye; that wife is the wife of T. T. Dye; that wife is the wife of W. W. Dye; that J. J. Gamble is the husband of Sallie Gamble; that Joe Crawford is the husband of Nora Crawford; that Minnie Ware is the wife of Augustus Ware; that wife is the wife of Albert Ware; Joe Handcox is the husband of Mattie Handcox.

X. That Mark Ware, Frank Ware, James Ware, Mattie Handcox, Joe Handcox, Ollie Ware, Esther Ware, Georgia Ware, Cora Ware, Samuel Ware, Sallie Gamble and J. R. Dye are minors, and are without general or testamentary guardians in this State.

XI. That J. R. Dye and Sallie Gamble are minors and are entitled to their homestead in the above described real estate.

XII. That Elizabeth Dye is the widow of the said Perry Dye, dec'd, and she joins as plaintiff in this petition, and respectfully sheweth to this Court that her late husband died intestate in Cleveland County, State of North Carolina, in the year, 18...., leaving him surviving the aforesaid named heirs at Law, and she further sheweth that her said husband during his coverture with her was seized and possessed in fee simple of the real estate fully described in paragraph III of this petition.

Wherefore, she prays the Court to have her dower allotted to her out of said real estate, and to this end that a writ of dower be issued to the Sheriff of Cleveland County, commanding him to summons three freeholders, connected with the parties neither by consanguinity nor affinity, entirely disinterested, and qualified to act as jurors, to view the said real estate, and to allot to her in value one third part thereof, including the dwelling house and all out-houses, buildings and improvements appertaining thereto, for the term of her natural life, and to report their proceedings in due form of law to this Court.

XIII. That the parties desire to hold their interests in said real ^{estate} or the proceeds thereof in severalty, but since it is necessary to sell a portion thereof for the payment of said indebtedness and costs of said administration, and since the same is incumbered with said homesteads and said dower, it is more advantageous to all the parties interested that the whole of said real estate be sold by said administrator under the direction of this Court, subject to the aforesaid incumbrances, for assets and for partition among the heirs at law.

Wherefore, your petitioners pray that a decree be made by this Court for a sale of the whole of said real estate on such terms as the Court may direct by said administrator, and that the proceeds of said sale may be constituted as assets in his hands for the payment of said debts and costs of this administration; that the surplus, if any, be distributed to the heirs at law according to their rights and interests; that a homestead be allotted to the minors, J. A. Dye and Sallie Cambie; and that a guardian ad litem be appointed to defend and represent the interests of all the aforesaid minors in this proceeding.
