

## Thomas Dye & Sarah Lucy Pulliam

Thomas Dye was born November 1799 and died in Madisonville, Monroe Co, TN of Cancer of the Ear on in November 1884. Tom & Lucy are buried at Piney Grove Baptist Church Cemetery, Madisonville, Monroe Co, TN.

*According to census data, Thomas and his brother, William were twins both born circa November 1799. This date was arrived at by looking clearly at the 1850 Census data, as well as, earlier census data. The 1850 Census of William in Monroe Co, TN and Thomas in Habersham Co, GA, clearly indicated they were the same age and the censuses were taken in Oct and Dec 1850.*

*William 50 in October and Thomas was 51 in December.*

*This meaning that Williams Census was taken before the November Birthday and Thomas after the*

*November birthday. Twins have long run in the Dye line.*

*In 1850 William resided in Monroe Co, TN and this census was taken on Oct 23, 1850, William states he was 50 years old and his wife Sarah 47, this is the only Census he appears that gives his exact age.*

*Looking at Thomas in Habersham Co, GA, this census was taken Dec 13, 1850 and Thomas is 51 years old.*

Thomas Dye was born in Chester Co, SC to Henry & Anna Dye. By early 1800, the family sold their land in Chester Co, SC and moved to Rutherford Co, NC along the Millstone Fork of the Sandy Run Creek. Tom was raised in Rutherford Co, NC. In 1808, his father, Henry Dye passed away.

His mother remarried to Casper Webber Sr. and he went to live in the Webber household. Mr. Webber's children by his first wife were grown, and these children of Anna's were on the 1810 Census in the Casper Webber household. About 1817, Thomas married Sarah Lucille Pulliam, the daughter of Revolutionary War Veteran, Zachary Pulliam, and his wife, Sarah Black.

The Pulliams were natives of Virginia, but had resided in South Carolina at the time, Tom met Lucy.

Thomas appears in the Rutherford County Court of Pleas and Qtr Sessions in 1833 when his property, inherited from his Father, is sold at auction. The land is also owned by his youngest brother Gilbert. About 1840, Gilbert moved his family into Spartanburg Co, SC, and Anna Dye Webber resided with him, as her husband had died in 1818. To be near her ailing Father, Tom & Lucy, bring the family to Habersham Co, GA in the mid-1830s and they remain there until after Zach Pulliams death and about 1852, Thomas moves the family to Monroe Co, TN. His twin brother, William and Williams wife Sarah, die and leave property and several young children who are split up in the family or quickly marry. Tom was known to be a Republican and against slavery.

There is a known letter of record from grandson, Jennis Dye. Much information is available regarding the Pulliam line.

The 1880 Monroe Co, TN Mortality Census indicates that Lucy Dye age 80 born NC parents born VA, VA, Housekeeper, Died in Oct 1880 of injuries on falling. She was walking in the creek and slipped and fell.

The known children of Thomas & Lucy Pulliam Dye.

**Malinda Dye Bailey** b. Jan 1818 in Rutherford Co, NC and died about 1904 in Folsom, Bartow Co, GA.

She married John Hiram Bailey February 2, 1839 in Rutherford Co, NC.

John "Hiram" Bailey is the son of John & Nancy Bailey. Both were buried at Hayes Cemetery, at Bartow Co, GA. Their children include: Malinda Cenith "Cenia" Bailey Stubblefield, Nancy Druscilla Bailey, John Hiram Bailey, W P Bailey, Priscilla Bailey, D E Bailey, Leonard Washington Bailey, Joseph Bailey, Martha Elizabeth Bailey Peace, William H Bailey, George Thomas Bailey, Robert Francis Bailey.

**John Dye** b. 1820 d. 1866 He had a short marriage to Louisa Elizabeth, a German girl from about 1846-1852. Louisa had 2 sons, Phillip Dye b. 1847 and Albert Dye b. 1848. When Louisa died, John married Minerva Harris Nov 26, 1857 in Monroe Co, TN.

John was born in Rutherford Co, NC and died in Monroe Co, TN shortly after the end of the Civil War.

With Minerva Harris, he had Franklin M Dye b. Feb 28, 1859 d. April 1, 1945 in Vancouver, WA.

Mary Dye b. 1861 d. 1945 in Utah, and Joseph Z Dye b. 1866 d. 1941 at Yountville, CA. Minerva Dye remarried to John H Sykes about 1869, they moved to Utah, where they had children,

Elizabeth, William, John & Martha Sykes from 1870-1878.

**Sarah Ann Dye McBrayer** b. 1825 d ca 1881 Rising Fawn, Dade Co, GA Sarah was the 2<sup>nd</sup> wife, of William McBrayer, the son of David and Delilah McBrayer of Rutherford Co, NC. William & Sallie married Jan 11, 1841 in Rutherford Co, NC. William's First wife, Druscilla Green had passed on and left him with 4 children. William was born Jan 7, 1805 in Rutherford Co, NC. He had married Druscilla Green, Jun 24, 1824. They had Leah, Druscilla, Alfred & Green McBrayer.

*Wm McBrayer was listed as a Deacon of the Buffalo Bapt Church which is now located in Cherokee Co, SC; Other Deacons include Jacob Green, Gabriel Washburn and Richard Wilkins*

*Berryman Hicks was the minister, and the Elders are listed as Wm Davidson, James Bridges and James Byars.*

Children of William & Sallie Dye McBrayer are: Thomas Jefferson McBrayer, Jane, Amanda Isabelle McBrayer Sharrock, Lorenzo D, Robert, Lucy, Josephine, Olly T, Ibly P, Mary Ann McBrayer. & Commodore McBrayer. William died about 1880 and Sallie, sometime later, at Rising Fawn, Dade Co, GA.

**George Dye** b. 1830 Rutherford Co, NC grew up in Monroe Co, TN and married two daughters of Joseph & Margaret Houk Smith of Monroe Co, TN, This family had also, moved to Monroe Co, TN from Rutherford Co, NC. George Dye, 1<sup>st</sup> married Jane Smith. Her Family moved to McCleansboro, IL and George followed. After her Father died, Jane and her siblings, Taylor, Eliza and Wiley Smith are residing with William McClean, in Hamilton Co, IL. They are working as domestic help. By 1875, Jane Smith Dye, passed away leaving George with William M Dye, Joseph A Dye, Enoch Columbus "Lum" Dye, and Thomas Dye. He married Jane's sister, Louisa "Eliza" Smith who was then 38 to his 50 years, they had a

daughter, Effie L Dye b. Feb 1880.

Jane and Eliza's mother Peggy Houk Smith resided with their brother, Taylor Smith, in 1880 at Knights Prarie, Hamilton Co, IL.

**Joseph Dye** b. 1836 d. Jan 25, 1865 Private Enlisted in Union Army Aug 8, 1862

Mustered out Aug 8, 1862

Died Jan 25, 1865

10th Regimental Infantry Co E

Joseph married Melvina Unknown

Melvina Dye was born about 1836, She is not known to have had any children with Joseph, She remarried to J P Smith March 21, 1866 at Hamilton Co, TN. It is thought that she could have resided in Stoddard Co, MO at the time of her death.

**M "Sintha" Dye Hamilton** b. 1832 is buried at Madisonville, Monroe Co, TN near her parents at, Piney Grove Baptist Church. Sintha married Alfred L. Hamilton on Aug 14, 1873 at Monroe Co, TN.

Alfred was the son of John Hamilton and Mary Emaline Welden.

Alfred remarried after the death of Sintha Dye Hamilton to Mrs. Harriet A Stephens Rollers on March 29, 1892

**Jennings Dye** b. 1840 Habersham Co, GA d. 1826 Monroe Co, TN

married Catherine Tipton on August 10, 1858 at Monroe Co, TN Catherine was born 1840 and died 1925 in Monroe Co, TN. Jennings appeared on the 1890 Civil War Census for TN MO-123-2

Children of Jennings and Catherine Tipton Dye: George Dye 1860, Tabitha L Baker Burger, Tabitha's 1<sup>st</sup> husband was David E Baker , brother of Mary Jane Baker whom married a cousin, Perry Dye, son of John Dye & Ailey Hill, her second husband was John L Burger. William Dye that married Alice McDonald, Eliza Dye Thompson, Mary Dye Moses, Albert John Dye wife, Nancy Lewis, and Englentine Dye b. July 1880.

**William M Dye** b. Aug 14, 1841 (NC, but the family was living in Habersham Co, GA?)

died May 3, 1918 Monroe Co, TN married Sarah "Jane" Rider on February 2, 1873. Jane was daughter of Samuel R Rider and Mahala Caroline Rule. Sarah was born February 2, 1852 and died January 5, 1908 at Tellico Plains in Monroe Co, TN. Both are buried at Tellico Plains Baptist Church Cemetery.

Children include: Jennis E Dye, Amanda, Columbus , Maty, Miney and Charles Dye.
